Hips V Knees 2020: Thanks to Bob Bowyer for this update on our annual highlight.

We are now about to play our 5th annual HIPS v KNEES match sponsored by the AOA and also some other sponsorships. (AOA - Australian Orthopaedic Association) Unfortunately, we are still aware of significant scepticism and fear of these operations in the public and some sporting groups. We hope that the publicity associated with our annual Bionic Cup match will reduce this.

In publicity for our event last year, President of the AOA, Dr Andrew Ellis, said “that such an event is a celebration of the wonder of movement and provides the Australian orthopaedic community a chance to reflect on the significant contribution that hip and knee replacement surgery provides thousands of Australians every year. Being able to enjoy the freedom of movement, let alone undertake sporting endeavours, just wouldn’t be possible without significant advances in prosthesis technology and the improvement of surgical technique over the past 80 years.”

This year in response to suggestions on improvements to the presentation of the event we have introduced numbered shirts and will produce a program with details of the teams and the game to assist spectators, sponsors and the media.

The match will be conducted at the WA Hockey stadium on the 16th December between 3.30 pm and 5:00 pm. The teams have been selected and shirt sizes obtained to allow production of the numbered shirts to proceed.

The Christchurch captain in the same years was Ric Charlesworth. He played at Centre Half Back as I did. I made it into the Hale School first eleven in third year and fourth year before leaving and going back to Albany, where I played in the Men's competition and Country Week sides.

My wife Helen, son Ian and I moved to Perth in 1999, to further Ian's hockey, by enrolling him in the Como hockey school. I played winter grass hockey with Wasps for some years before moving to Victoria Park. I gave grass hockey away last year because we lost our weekend shop staff and I decided to do the weekends myself, rather than employ a new person. I have been playing Wednesday turf hockey for a number of years now and thoroughly enjoy it.

As a footnote, because we are very proud of him, our son Ian has played in every State Representative side u/15's, u/16's, u/18's, u/21's and Thundersticks. He has also represented Australia in the u/16 schoolboys tour to South Africa, The Junior World Cup in Rotterdam, and in the Kookaburras at various overseas tours, Aslan Shah cup in Malaysia, and test matches in Australia.

I've played hockey most of my life as Melville hockey club was born out of Applecross hockey which began opposite my house on Gairloch Oval. I joined Old Wesley when I was at high school at Wesley College. I briefly went back to Melville for a few years to try to help them into what was A1s back in the day and played with the nickname Ted, my hockey name.

Recently I helped organize a catch-up with guys who played for Old Wesley some 40 years ago when we played at the WACA. Back in those days the top competition was dominated by Cricketers (who became Wolves) and Old Mods. One of the highlights our group agreed on was beating Cricketers 3-1 with Ric Charlesworth and Bob Andrew both being sent off. We used 28 ounce Vampire sticks at fullback and over the years plenty of funny goalkeepers.

I was the 'enforcer' back then and I one game after an opposition player from Perth hit the ball into my shins after the whistle had blown, I dropped my stick, he took off and we had to start the game again without him as he wouldn't come back from the car park where he was hiding! About 34 years ago my wife Kaye and I helped set up Minkey at Wesley South Perth, to be

succeeded by Alan Stewart and all the other parents who have kept Minkey alive and well. From the WACA Old Wesley days, as Paul Wright retired this year the only guys left still playing are Roger Davey and myself. Along the way there has been the merger of South Perth & Old Wesley and then in 2008 the South Perth women & WASP men's sides.

I've enjoyed the camaraderie and friendships and have an innate trust of anyone who is a hockey player. *(Thanks Greg - so do many of us, me included. Ed.)*

I really looked forward to turning 40 from my mid 30s so that I could play State hockey and in my 40s couldn't wait to turn 50 to play mid-week vets. In my 50s I was looking forward to turning 60 so that I could play Grand Masters which has been fantastic too. Back in my 40s George Winning and John Dunstan used to talk about the Buffers so I was aware of a midweek comp but didn't appreciate how great it was until I played. It breaks your week in half, you could be having a lousy Monday or Tuesday and then have a run on Wednesday and feel great again. I tell people now that it may seem like a doddle, playing for a colour, no finals but eventually it becomes a favourite as you're playing with guys you normally compete with & making new friends and sometimes even improving!

In many ways wearing a colour instead of a tribal top, playing all year round for fun and with no finals it feels like I've gone full cycle back to minkey.

**A CHANCE MOMENT AT A BOATING EVENT CHANGED THE LIFE OF ROBERT CROFTS,
WHO HAS GONE ON TO BECOME A CHAMPION PARA SAILOR**

I first became involved in sailing when . . . on a rainy Sunday I wheeled into the Perth International Boat Show at Elizabeth Quay to get out of the rain – or so I thought. I was immediately drawn to Sailability WA's display and I had an incredible realisation that I'd discovered what I had unknowingly been searching for. This chance encounter changed my life forever.

To my great surprise and frustration . . . I finished last in my first race in December, 2017. I later learnt that WA's Para sailing fleet is one of the strongest in Australia . . . so there's certainly no shame in coming last . . . to begin with anyway.


Throughout my life I have always been active and competitive . . . and I was incredibly proud to represent WA in the Over-55 division two team at the hockey Masters Australian Championships in Cairns in October, 2015. Hockey was always my first love from childhood and this was certainly the pinnacle of my sporting life. I scored a couple of goals during the tournament and we defeated NSW 5-0 to win the gold medal – so happy days.

But unknown to me . . . on the flight home from Cairns a deep vein thrombosis developed in my left leg and a few weeks later I suffered a rare spinal cord infarction caused by a blood clot restricting the blood supply to my spinal cord. Over 24 hours, what initially began as mild chest pain and numbness in my foot

escalated upwards and resulted in paraplegia. **I instinctively knew that sport . . .** was going to be central to my rehabilitation and after 99 days in hospital and reading *Pushing the Limits* by Kurt Fearnley I joined the WA Marathon Club and set about building my wheelchair skills. Since then I have completed six half marathons and three 42km marathons. Wheelchair racing is perfect cross-training for sailing and I believe this has given me an edge. I've also benefited enormously from training with Australian Para sailing coach Grant Alderson. I travelled to the US and Spain to compete in 2018 and 2019 Para World Sailing Championships and achieved a world ranking of 26. I won gold this year in Melbourne at the 2020 Australian Para Sailing Championships and also the 2020 WA championships in both the Hansa Liberty and Hansa 303 fleets. I recently had the honour of being named the 2020 Australian Sailing Para Sailor of the Year for WA and also the WA Disabled Sports Association's Sports Star of the Year.

In the future . . . I'm looking forward to the 2020-21 season and the resumption of club racing at RPYC. The 2021 Hansa Class World Championships are scheduled for Sicily in October next year and a new group of Para sailors is training to represent WA.

I promise you . . . there is no greater feeling than leaving your wheelchair behind on the dock as you sail out of the RPYC marina into the majestic waters of Matilda Bay.
