<u>Vale Colin Nicholas</u>: It was with much regret that we heard recently of the death of former long serving WA Hockey President and Hockey Australia President Colin Nicholas. He was also a former WHM player. Hockey WA has a comprehensive tribute on their website which I have included on Page 3. This includes details of the funeral service.

Nominations Open For WA State Teams: Those of you who wish to play for the WA Metro teams in this year's interstate championship in Perth can nominate now for all age groups up to and including the new O/80s. You can get to the online form via the WA Masters Hockey website home page and to complete a nomination you will need to be registered with Hockey Australia and also to log in. Nominating requires a fee of \$55 and is due to be open until 5:00 pm on the Friday before the first selection trials. At the moment these are due to be held on 5th June for ages from O/35 to O/60 inclusive and 7th June for ages from O/65 to O/75 inclusive..

Nominations Open For WA Country Teams: Nominations are also open for Country but the O/80s are not available yet. The process is a little more complicated than the Metro site and you need to be able to log in to the Revo WAC website. The link to log in is:

After logging in you click "Membership" and from that screen you need to click "Account" which is up at the top right hand corner of the screen. Then click "Profile" which will allow you to amend your details as well as nominate for the tournament.

<u>Tribute to Colin Nicholas</u>: This is taken from the Hockey WA website and I have included it in full as it fills in the gaps in my own knowledge and the Mods tribute.

"Hockey WA is saddened to hear of the passing of former Hockey WA and Hockey Australia President Colin Nicholas OAM.

Colin was President of Hockey Australia and Hockey WA in the 1990's. A life member of Hockey WA, Colin was a popular figure in Australian hockey circles and contributed decades of time and service to the sport at club, state and national level.

As an architect, Colin was involved in the planning and design of the current Perth Hockey Stadium at Curtin University, ensuring it was built in time for the 1979 Esanda Tournament. Due to federal funding from former Prime Minister Malcolm Fraser, the stadium was named the Commonwealth Hockey Stadium when it was officially opened.

Colin was also instrumental in the group that established the Australian Institute of Sport hockey programme in Perth in 1984. Heavily involved with Old Modernians Hockey Club in Perth, he was President of the WA Hockey Association and then President of the Australian Hockey Association (AHA) - the men's hockey association.

Colin was also awarded OAM in the Queen's Birthday list in 1991 for his services to hockey.

Also a foundation member of Masters hockey in WA, Colin regularly played midweek hockey at Perth Hockey Stadium at Curtin University. He also toured with the Hotspurs team to London in 1986 for the Kookaburras' successful World Cup.

During his time, Colin also continued to drive and promote hockey's reputation as a strong family orientated sport.

"We can look forward to a strong future for hockey, particularly in the 'Year of the Family' because hockey is a family-based sport."

Hockey WA expresses its sincere condolences to Colin's family at this sad time.

The Funeral Service for Mr Colin Nicholas OAM of City Beach will be held at Holy Spirit Church, 2 Keaney Place, City Beach on TUESDAY (9.05.2023) at 11.00am. Followed by a Private Cremation. *See also picture on Page 4.*

The play was not too bad at times in the light of all the missing stars. Goal of the day had to go to Ken Walter's impeccably placed and struck penalty corner which was the middle leg of his hat trick. Pass of the day goes to Ivan Wilson for a real defence splitter through to Scott Blackwell which led directly to Blue's goal. 


